Mount Mary University's Spanish major creates unique opportunities for students to become lifelong learners of languages and cultures.

The ability to bridge cultural barriers in today's ever-shifting global society begins with learning a world language and then broadens to include a whole world of opportunities.

A degree in Spanish prepares students to live and work in a competitive, interdependent world. Mount Mary students develop literacy in global matters, multiculturalism and cultural diversity, while developing language proficiency and becoming contributing members of our global society.

Mount Mary offers small, interactive classes conducive to world language learning. The program fosters critical thinking and intellectual growth and augments students' appreciation of varied literature and civilizations. Using a communicative approach to teaching, instructors often use role-playing to place students in real-life situations where they must not only know the language, but also understand cultural variables that can impact intercultural communication.

Spanish Major

Mount Mary's Spanish major is designed to develop the student's ability to understand, speak, read and write Spanish, as well as comprehend and analyze culture and literature. A Spanish minor is also available.

Post-Baccalaureate Certificate

Mount Mary offers a Spanish post-baccalaureate certificate for students who have already earned a bachelor's degree.

Student Activities

Mount Mary's International Club invites both international and United States students to increase their understanding of world languages and cultures. Activities include enrichment trips, social gatherings and orientation for international students. Mount Mary students have also found leadership opportunities through coordinating field trips and raising funds for local Hispanic organizations, as well as participating in Students Achieving Leadership through Spanish Activities (SALSA).
