The 3+3 pre-pharmacy program is a unique partnership between Mount Mary University and the Medical College of Wisconsin (MCW). The program provides a direct route for full-time Mount Mary students who successfully complete their pharmacy program prerequisites to gain direct admission into the Doctor of Pharmacy program at MCW.

Students can obtain both a Bachelor of Science (BS) degree in Human Biology (prepharmacy concentration) from Mount Mary and a Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) degree from MCW in six years (3+3). This is accomplished through "reverse transfer" of MCW coursework to fulfill some requirements for Mount Mary's BS degree.

To qualify for the program, incoming Mount Mary freshmen must have scored a minimum 19 on the ACT exam and have earned a cumulative high school grade point average (GPA) of 3.0. To participate in the early assurance direct admission agreement, students must:

- Maintain full-time status and earn a 3.2 or higher cumulative GPA
- Earn at least a C letter grade or better in specific MCW School of Pharmacy pre-requisite courses
- Earn a B letter grade or better in College Research Writing and an oral communications class
- Complete a minimum of 90 semester credit hours to qualify for graduate financial aid at MCW
- Submit an application essay; and acknowledge in writing their ability to meet the School of Pharmacy Technical Standards for Admission, Promotion and Graduation
- Participate in an early entrance interview at MCW and be recommended by the pharmacy faculty for program admission.

About the Medical College of Wisconsin

The Medical College of Wisconsin Pharmacy School is the only three-year Pharm.D. program in the Midwest located at an academic medical center, providing access to the world-renowned resources at Froedtert Hospital, Children's Hospital of Wisconsin, and the Clement J. Zablocki VA Medical Center.
