Over 70 students from Illinois,





Summer Leadership Academy – Afternoon Sessions

Arts & Design Pathway

This pathway included sessions introducing concepts in:

- Studio Art
- Fashion Design
- Merchandise Management
- Graphic Design
- Interior and Architectural Design
- Art Therapy



Humanities & Business Pathway

In this pathway, students played a Reacting to the Past role playing game which included the following:

- Students were assigned a historical figure/character role with specific goals.
- Students learned to communicate, collaborate, and compete effectively to advance their objectives.
- Students created their own way of expressing their character's ideas persuasively in papers, speeches, or other public presentations.
- Students participated in negotiations, budget, and interview sessions.



STEM Pathway

Through a variety of hands-on experiences students were introduced to concepts in the following areas:

- UX (User Experience)
- Nursing
- Occupational Therapy (OT)
- Psychology
- Art Therapy/Counseling
- Food Science
- Dietetics



Summer Leadership Academy – Evening Sessions

Pre-Academy and Post-Academy Surveys




Summer Leadership Academy participants were asked to complete Pre-Academy and Post-Academy Surveys to measure their understanding of concepts and how they felt they have grown in their understanding of themselves and their preparedness for the world after high school.


I feel like I can make informed decisions about my life after high school.

Participants' feelings about their ability to make informed life decisions after high school improved from 69% agreeing or strongly agreeing that they are able to do so prior to the academy to 84% post-academy.




Post - Academy

Participants' feelings about their comfort with researching their college options improved from 71% agreeing or strongly agreeing that they are able to do so prior to the academy to 93% post-academy.





I am aware of a variety of sources of funding to help make college affordable.





Participants' feelings about their ability to correlate their top 3 interests to potential jobs and career clusters improved from 70% agreeing or strongly agreeing prior to the academy to 85% post-academy.




I have knowledge of online resources available to me and am able to further conduct research into career clusters.

Participants' knowledge of resources for career clusters improved from 57% agreeing or strongly agreeing that they have this knowledge prior to the academy to 88% post-academy.







I understand the concept of "sisterhood."






I understand that we are all affected by racism and overcoming it is ongoing and communal.

Participants' feelings about their understanding of overcoming racism being ongoing and communal improved from 44% strongly agreeing that they understand this prior to the academy to 60% post-academy.



- "I have learned that sisterhood is an important thing and is a great thing to have. Also, just the experience was great and fun and educational."





Participants' understanding of the definition of vocation improved from 53% agreeing or strongly agreeing with this statement prior to the academy to 79% post-academy.




2022 Post Survey Quotes






I understand the three different levels of NCAA College Athletics (D1-D3).





Participants' feelings about their knowledge of study abroad scholarships improved from 20% agreeing or strongly agreeing that they know of at least one study abroad scholarship prior to the academy to 57% post-academy.

Small Groups

Each Summer Leadership Academy participant met with their small groups once daily for an hour. Small groups were led by Peer and Adult Mentors. Peer Mentors are young women who have participated in a previous Summer Leadership Academy. Adult Mentors are Mount Mary University employees, or community members who support the Peer Mentors in leading the small groups. This year, the Academy had the largest group of "support staff" yet with 15 Peer Mentors and 8 Adult Mentors.





- "I am better at connections and being social. I am also better at realizing that self discovery is very important as well as stepping out of your comfort zone."
