Zoom Training Resources for Faculty

Zoom is now available for use in your courses through the Learning Management System (LMS) you are using; either Canvas or ELearning.

Downloading Zoom

If you have not yet accessed Zoom on your personal computer and/or device, please do so at: https://zoom.us and use your MMU email and password.

If you are using Zoom from a campus computer, you will need to install the Zoom client from the Software Center on the computer first. IT Services is working on making this available, and expect to have it deployed to the campus shortly. They will send an message to faculty once it is available.

Accessing Zoom

To begin using Zoom, enter your course and click the Zoom link in the course menu to the left. The training below will get you started based on the LMS you're using of either Canvas or ELearning. Note: If you have used Zoom, the only main difference in using it through the LMS is in the scheduling of your sessions. After that, using Zoom in your sessions is essentially the same.

Note: As you begin the training below, you will see content related to recording sessions. You will want to use Cloud Recordings because you cannot upload video files to ELearning, and because the captioning is available only through Cloud Recordings.

Due to the "Zoom bombing" in which hackers invade Zoom sessions, you will be required to use a password and the waiting room for your sessions. The use of these will be described in the training videos below. Note: Before the Zoom bombing, users had flexibility in sharing their screen, but Zoom now requires the host to allow someone to share his or her screen.
