Mount Mary College Presents Free Diversity Lecture

History and Role of Islam in America and in the African American Community Explored

MILWAUKEE (February 23, 2012) – Mount Mary College will offer a free lecture on diversity issues on Tuesday, March 6, 2012, at 7 p.m. in Stiemke Hall, located on the second floor of Notre Dame Hall on Mount Mary's campus. The event is free and open to the public.

The lecture, "Being Muslim in America: An African American Perspective" will be presented by Ronald B. Shaheed, Director of Education, Clara Mohammed School, Milwaukee, and Basimah R. Abdullah, Principal, Clara Mohammed School, Inc., Milwaukee. The presentation will provide a brief history of Islam including the development of Islam in America and among African Americans, women in Islam in American and perspectives on Islam in America's future.

This lecture is part of Mount Mary's Foley-Poehlman Diversity Lecture Series, which aims to broaden discussion around diversity and how it impacts our lives. The series is named for long-time Mount Mary College professors Sister Mary Briant Foley, SSND, (history, retired) and Sister Joanne Poehlman, SSND (anthropology).
